## Women in Black UK Newsletter, Spring 2023

Greetings and welcome to our latest newsletter. Little did we expect at the start of 2022 that we would be facing a new and protracted war. While maintaining a broader focus on militarism, the arms trade, Palestine & Israel and more, a number of our groups have - from time to time - focused on this war and all the issues and concerns it raises. Good to read that there have also been celebrations and a more concerted effort to share our story and messages on social media. This encouraging round-up of news is testimony to the resilience and commitment of Women in Black members around the UK and beyond.

#### From Bradford Women in Black.

Since the last newsletter in May 2022 Bradford WIB have continued to hold monthly vigils on the 1st Thursday of the month, an continue to receive positive comments from the public.. As well as our banners protesting against all wars and militarism and in favour of peace we have had banners and leaflets on specific issues. These have included solidarity with Yemen, women in Iran, the Hazara community in Afghanistan, sending asylum seekers to Rwanda and remembering Hiroshima. On 11th November we stood in silence to remember all those killed and affected by war and gave out free white poppies. In September we took part in welcoming six cyclists from the Bike for Peace group from Norway who are campaigning for a world without nuclear weapons. We have taken part in protests supporting the Menwith Hill Accountability Campaign. Some members joined the CND protests at RAF Lakenheath in Suffolk in May and November against the proposals to bring US nuclear bombs to the UK.

The group meet on the 1st Thursday of each month between 4.30-5.30 in the centre of Bradford, junction of Bank St and Hustlergate.

From Women in Black Leeds.

Leeds Women in Black hold silent vigils twice a month on the first and third Tuesdays, 12.30-1.30pm, in Dortmund Square in Leeds City Centre. There are usually around 7-12 women displaying our two large banners "Free Palestine" and "End the Occupation". We also hand out our A5 leaflet to passers-by, providing basic information about the situation in Palestine/Israel. (See attached leaflet). In recent months it feels like there has been more interest and awareness from passers-by and people quite often take a photograph of us that we hope they will share on social media. We update our Facebook page every fortnight with a photograph and brief comment about the vigil. Last autumn some of us got together to celebrate Leeds Women in Black's third birthday

#### From Women in Black London.

We have been able to meet every Wednesday, with numbers ranging between 5 and 14 women. We have noticed that weather and dark nights make interaction with the public more difficult. We are always encouraged when people stop to chat or sign a petition and being in central London we attract many overseas visitors. At the start of the war in Ukraine we held our vigil in St Martin's Place, while the Ukrainian community held rallies in nearby Trafalgar Square. Our presence, with its more questioning and inclusive messages did create some in-depth conversations. The themes we have covered in our vigils and hand-out leaflets include:

Ukraine and Russia, Arms sales to Saudi Arabia, Refugee Women and War, Justice for Palestinians, Violence of war and conflict and women, Nuclear Weapon Ban Treaty, Global Military Spending, Remembrance and War and Christmas Peace.

A new resource created this year is our QR code which links to more information about WiB London on the international website. We now use this on our leaflets and several of our placards carry the code. We have actually seen people scan the code on their mobiles!

The group meet weekly to vigil on Wednesdays, 6-7pm, around the statue of Edith Cavell (St Martin's Place).
