We have been concentrating our latest vigils on the situation in Palestine. We have also been taking part in demonstrations against the weapons factory in Brighton where bomb release mechanisms are made for the bombs being dropped in Gaza. This has been included in our leaflets and we have helped collect signatures for a petition to Brighton and Hove City Council asking them to refuse permission for the extension to the factory to become permanent.

Leeds

Tricia writes: Since October, Leeds Women in Black now hold silent vigils every Tuesday, 12.30-1.30pm, in Dortmund Square in Leeds City Centre usually attended by approximately 30 women. In addition to our original two large banners "Free Palestine" and "End the Occupation" we now also display "Ceasefire Now" and "Stop the Genocide". We hand out our A5 leaflet to passers-by (around 500 a week), providing information about the situation in Palestine/Israel; we update this every 6-8 weeks to ensure that it contains relevant, current information.

In recent months there has been more interest and awareness from passers-by and people often take a photograph of us that we hope they will share on social media. We update our Facebook page each week with a photograph and brief comment about the vigil. This year in August we will have been holding Women in Black vigils regularly for 5 years.

London - Euston Road

Miri writes: This vigil was started in direct response to the events of 7 October and since in Israel/Palestine. The first was held on 14 October 2023 at the Nelson Mandela Bust on South Bank, but as we were not allowed to continue on this spot which is on private property, we moved to Euston Road outside Friends House, where we now stand every Saturday from 12:00 to 13:00. An average of 40 women attend each time, with 70 our highest point so far, and around 20 our lowest. The vigil is attended by some Israeli and Jewish women living in London, some of whom were part of the original WiB vigils in 1988, or attended vigils during the 90s and 00's in Jerusalem. Women from the Wednesday WiB London vigils at the Edith Cavell statue also join us regularly. Other regular attendees include antiracist feminist and human rights activists and lawyers. Some of us continue on from the vigil to the big Palestine marches as well.

London – Edith Cavell Statue

Liz writes: Since October 7th there have been three London Women in Black groups (although the Haringay vigil has stopped), so as not to mix us all up I have identified us as the Edith Cavell WiB group.

Between 10 and 20 of us have continued to meet every Wednesday from 6 to 7:00 pm. Our vigils have covered a number of topics including: the continuing occupation of Palestine by Israel; attacks by Hamas; the ongoing war in Gaza; Global Days of Action on Military Spending (GDAMs), which were interactive vigils asking the public what they would spend £56 billion (the UK's spending on Military); International Women's day focusing on violence against women; the arms trade; White Poppy's, (remembrance) linking armed conflict, war and its effect on the environment; give a gift of peace for Christmas; Russian WiBs photo exhibition against Russia's war in Ukraine. Our vigils continue to display large placards that display a clear message to the public, plus a QR code for people to scan. We hand out around 200 leaflets to passersby, often with a petition or letter to send to the Prime Minister and MPs.

North-East Coast

Anne writes: As Women In Black @ North East Coast we stand with countless women all over the world who seek to end all forms of violence, and assert that freedom, peace and justice go hand in hand. We stand in silence for those whose lives are destroyed by violence, conflict and war and recognise that women and children are often the majority of casualties. We bear witness to the ongoing genocide in Palestine and call for an immediate and permanent ceasefire. We are outraged by the violence and atrocities there and around the world and we stand in solidarity with all peoples against war, and the war machine.

We held our first event on 8th March for International Women's Day when over 70 of us gathered for a silent lantern walk from Cullercoats to Tynemouth ending with a human peace symbol on the beach. We made a fire of hope and people spoke, recited poems and sang songs of hope and resistance.

Since then we hold a regular silent vigil by the sea, bearing witness to the ongoing genocide in Palestine, sending our love and solidarity carried on the waves, unrestrained by borders or barriers. Towards the end we make time for discussion, to update on local related activity and plan our next actions. We organise around local events in Newcastle and join with other rallies in the city centre and recently at the 'Shut Down Rafael' rally focused on the State of Israel owned weapons factory in the city, implicated in the genocide in Palestine. Some members are supporters of the Newcastle University 'Apartheid off Campus' Student Encampment.

The group has produced publicity for events and an information leaflet for circulation and to raise awareness. Our Instagram page is in the making.

Oxford

Kathryn reports: Historically the Oxford Women in Black group has been affiliated to NOW, the Network of Oxford Women. There is a diversity of political interests and affiliations among the women associated with WiB, and so -- because the Oxford vigil takes place on a Saturday afternoon -- women as activists are often tugged in many directions. Over the spring many Oxford WiBers have been travelling to London to support the Palestine solidarity marches there. The vigil continues, even with sometimes small numbers, to represent the feminist anti-militarist perspective in Oxford city centre. While continuing to emphasise the merit of anti-militarism as a philosophy, our vigils have reflected the strong feelings of participants in a focus on the specific crisis in Gaza. We are the subject of many photographs by passersby, and we have also had important conversations. We noticed that no-one was interested to receive a leaflet during the covid penumbra, but we are considering making a fresh attempt at offering leaflets!
